# Snowmobile Sales Outperform Economic Growth Worldwide



HASLETT, MI, July 23, 2019: A long lasting cold and snowy winter in much of the snowmobile community, and continued enthusiasm and interest in snowmobiling powered snowmobile sales to increase worldwide to 133,081 new sleds sold this past year. This is an increase of over 8,275 units, which is a 7 percent gain from last year. Sales in the United States grew to 55,025 new snowmobiles sold - a 3.7 percent gain from last year, while sales in Canada fell 0.1 percent to 46,784 new snowmobiles sold. The sales increase wasn't confined to North America. Sales increases were realized in Norway, Sweden, and Finland. Sales in Sweden increased 17 percent to 11,956 new snowmobiles sold and increases of 15 percent were reported in Norway and 26 percent increase in Finland. The largest national increase was in Russia where sales increased 88 percent over the previous year.

The snowmobile community is optimistic following the above average late snow fall throughout most of North America this past season. The 2019 manufacturers' spring snowmobile shows reported increases in attendance. In many of the spring shows, attendance was up over 20 percent. Spring orders were strong and that points to a good 2020 sales year.

The snowmobile industry reports that registered snowmobiles in North America totaled 1.85 million registered snowmobiles. Increased registration in Northern Europe continues.

# Our Eagle River Trip

February 23rd, 2019 - the day we have been waiting for! A group of us had started planning our snowmobile trip 5 months earlier to Eagle River, Wisconsin. Our planning started with 9 people going and now we are down to 5: my siblings - Carla Komar, Gerritt LaTourette and Grant LaTourette; my wife, Arline and I. Since there is no snow here in northeast Pennsylvania, the snowmobiles have been loaded for days, the trailers have been checked and rechecked, and the trucks are gassed up with the luggage packed and loaded. We checked with the owners, Marvin and Carol Radloff, at the Bridgewater Hotel in Eagle River, Wisconsin, and they say the trails are the best they have been in years. Our friend, Rory Will, who lives near Eagle River confirms the conditions are great. We plan to leave tomorrow morning around five. The weather forecast is calling for freezing rain overnight and high winds tomorrow afternoon.

We wake up to ice covered roads, which is no surprise. We are so anxious to get going that we don't even consider waiting for the roads to get better. We are going! We take our time through Honesdale and once we get to the Casey Highway near Scranton, the road is good and we can pick up the pace. We take Route 80 across Pennsylvania into Ohio. As we cross the state line, we start to encounter the high winds that they forecast. Our plan is to go up through Michigan and across the 5 mile Mackinac Bridge to the Upper Peninsula, stopping to visit the Top of the Lake Museum in Naubinway. The museum is right on Route 2, the road we will take across the U.P. to Wisconsin. By the end of the day Arline has checked the website for the Mackinac Bridge and found out that it has been closed for most of the day because of ice, wind, and snow. Our destination for the day becomes Grayling, Michigan.


Before we get there, we run into snow and the last hour of our trip for the day is slow going due to road conditions. We check into our hotel, get something to eat, and turn in for the night.

We wake up the next morning to 6 inches of fresh snow, so we eat breakfast and prepare to head out. Arline checks the Mackinac Bridge website and finds out the bridge is open, but with restrictions for high profile vehicles to be escorted across the 5 mile structure at 25 mph. As I pull around to the front of the hotel to pick up Arline, my brothers figure out that the trailer brakes are frozen and the wheels are not going around. There is a patch of bare pavement by the entrance, so we pull the trailer across that and the wheels break free.

We find the highway to be snow-covered and icy, which makes for slow going for the first 60 miles or so. We get to the bridge and are escorted across with no problems. When we reach Route 2, our GPS wants us to take a different route. But I say we want to take Route 2, so I turn anyway. We get less than a mile down the road and find out that the road is closed. So we turn around and follow our GPS. We arrive at the Top of the Lake Museum around 11 o'clock. If you're ever in the area, it's well worth the stop to see and the folks are friendly and well informed. We asked the gentleman at the museum about a good place locally to have lunch, took his very good advice and ate there, got gas and headed back on the road. The rest of the trip to Eagle River was uneventful, arriving around 5 o'clock CST.

On Tuesday, our first day riding, Marv suggested we ride up to Boulder Junction and eat at the Granary. So that's what we did and we had a great day, riding 120 miles though beautiful country on easy to follow, well groomed trails. Weekly on Wednesdays and Thursdays the local club, Sno-Eagles Snowmobile Club, does a ride and everybody's invited to ride with them.

On Wednesday Marv went with us and we rode with the locals. There were eight club members, three folks from Ohio plus the five of us. We rode to Lake Tomahawk and back, having a fun day, riding about 85 miles and we were back by 3 o'clock. Since it was early, we went to the International Snowmobile Hall of Fame at the Eagle River Racetrack.

On Thursday we rode with the locals again - seven of the same folks from the day before along with two new faces as well as the 3 folks from Ohio. Marv led the group. This day we rode to Argonne and back, which ended up being about 90 miles getting back early again. Arline was ready to call it a day, so we dropped her and Marv at the hotel and the rest of us went out for another short ride.

On Friday we trailered over to Manitowish Waters and met our friend, Rory, who took the day off from work to ride with us. We rode from Manitowish up to Hurley and back for about 100 miles for the day. On Saturday we hit the trails before anyone was out and got back early with around 80 miles ridden, loaded up the sleds for home and walked down town in Eagle River for souvenir shopping.

Sunday morning we headed out early for home. The day was uneventful until early afternoon when we hit snow again in Indiana. Arline was not interested in any more white-knuckled traveling on this trip, so we found a hotel around 3 o'clock after we saw a tractor trailer jackknifed in the median, calling it a day. The next morning brought clear sailing on the roads and we got on the way for home.

The riding in the area around Eagle River was excellent with well groomed trails and beautiful landscapes. Eagle River is a very friendly town with lots of excellent eateries and interesting shops, many accessible by snowmobile. The folks at Bridgewater Inn were accommodating and fun. My recommendation is to make Eagle River your next destination trip!
