September 2019

The subtle changes in temperature signal the start of snowmobile trail repair and equipment updates for the coming season. Find out what the local clubs are doing and offer to help or make a donation toward their efforts. PSSA mini-grants do not cover all costs nor were they ever intended to do so.

All clubs were recently sent a Club Survey to complete. PSSA needs this information to update club information. We use this data to show what the various clubs do to maintain trails and promote snowmobile recreation. We cannot continue to support clubs who do not provide this backup data. PSSA is responsible for the use of all grant funds. (If your club did not receive this survey or you need another link to it please call Kathy Woolever ASAP at the Palmyra Office.) If you have any questions please call me. Leave a message if I do not answer. Everyone's information is important to the future of our sport. Data talks in Washington and Harrisburg. Your cooperation is appreciated.

I have been told that several clubs are making a concerted effort to promote PSSA to their members. Clubs have benefited from the PSSA mini-grants totaling over \$500,000. Even if your club does not maintain trails they do have access to the thousands of miles of trails that are maintained by clubs. Your support of PSSA is needed to continue programs that support trails.

PSSA recently received a grant totally \$55,000 from Governor Wolf. Originally Julie McKenzie started the process then became ill. Lisa Vallimont, as the new Grant Administrator, stepped in and began to tweak the original with data and guidelines received. Together we added the maintenance of snowmobile trail miles used by other recreation groups to the narrative. PSSA thanks Julie for all her work and sends Congratulations on her recent marriage to Ted Mowatt, Vice-President of Wanner Associates. Also, Representative Ryan Bizzarro(D- Erie) was instrumental in PSSA receiving this grant.

NEP Sno Trails also received an equipment grant.

Lisa Vallimont will be meeting with Lori Elliott in mid-September to make the transition for writing grants as smooth as possible. Lori has been involved with PSSA for many years as the Executive Director and Grant Writer. Increased responsibilities at Wanner Associates made it impossible for her to continue as Grant Administrator. PSSA thanks Lori for all her time and effort spent helping make PSSA what it is today.

Travis Mathna, Roger Auker, Kathy Woolever and Committee are hard at work promoting the annual PA Powersports Show. Your help is needed to encourage local dealers to participate as a vendor or advertise for the event. This Show helps pay for trail and miscellaneous expenses.

Blizzard is once again sponsoring two trailers. An ATV has been donated by BRP and Pennsylvania Can Am dealers via the efforts of Roger Auker. More tickets are available by contacting the Palmyra Office. Volunteers should contact Travis Mathna for information.

Turnout remained strong over the summer probably in part due to the very good Patton Sportsman's food. Many club members arrive early to the meetings and grab supper there.

Several of our members were recently invited by the State Park to attend a DCNR Trail Construction Training event. They found the training to be very informative and enlightening and this should greatly assist us with the planned new trail in the state park. We're hoping that trail construction will take place in fall and early winter. If you'd like to help with that, please mark it on your membership application or attend a club meeting. Not all of our trail construction events are announced on Facebook so please let us know if you're interested in trail work or construction.

Some improvements were recently made to our trail connecting Prince Gallitzin State Park and Black Moshannon State Park. Another bridge was added to the trail, as well as mulch to smooth out some rocky spots. These were the worst spots on the trail and additional work will be done soon on the historic State Coach section of the trail. Not only will that part of the trail be improved but we'll also be placing historic signage telling the story of this early transportation artery. A club member has offered to donate the signage. We had some of the best riding in PA on our club trail last season. We were riding here when you couldn't ride other places. See the attached picture (previous page). Please remember that your dues help keep this trail open. We are dependent on club member dues to cover the cost of insurance and leases required for this trail. If you use this trail, please join or renew your club membership as soon as possible.

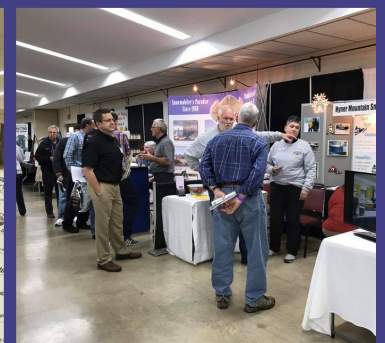

2019 USED SLED (And Other Toys) CORRAL

Another year has gone by and we are getting ready for the annual PSSA Powersports Show, again this year at the Lebanon Expo Center.

If you are not familiar with how you can sell your equipment at the Powersports Show, here is a quick explanation: Bring your equipment, park outside, enter the building and walk to the Used Sled Corral table. Fill out a 3-part carbon-less form for each item. You can save time by printing a sample form from the website (www.papowersports.com) and filling in all the info before coming to the show. Then transfer the info to the 3-part form. Pay the fee for each unit. Our friendly volunteers will then unload sleds and move trailers into the building. We do the rest!

On the form you will list the selling price and indicate if you are firm or negotiable on that price. You will list a 'bottom line' price if you choose negotiable. Our volunteers will not reveal the 'bottom line' to a potential buyer, but will attempt to get the highest price for you. If we sell your unit, we collect the money and hold it for you. Machines or money must be claimed no later than 5 pm on Sunday, an hour after the show closes.

Those machines that are not sold during the show are often sold later, as a result of someone seeing it at the show. They tell another person in the days following the show, that person calls for info, and the deal is made!

For current PSSA members, the fee for each unit (sled, trailer, motorcycle, or ATV) placed in the Corral will be \$25. Pay the fee when you arrive with your machine.

For the non-members, we will not require that they join PSSA, but the fee for them will be \$60 per unit. If they wish to join, they will save ten bucks by doing so, as the consignment fee will be \$25, and the membership is \$25, for a total of only \$50.

For those persons buying a unit, PSSA members can make a purchase with no extra charge, non-members will be charged a fee of \$35.

We expect most non-members to recognize the value of PSSA membership and make a decision to join (so they can save the extra ten bucks!). If a person does not wish to join, PSSA gets the ten dollars!

One very important feature of the Used Sled Corral is the great group of volunteers that make it happen. Over the years we have gotten to know a number of fine folks who help at the Corral. Some help for a few hours and others help many hours. Each and every one is appreciated; we can't do it without you. Allegheny National Forest conducts National Visitor Use Monitoring

Warren, Pa. (August 27, 2019) — The USDA Forest Service - Allegheny National Forest (ANF) will begin conducting National Visitor Use Monitoring (NVUM) in developed and dispersed recreation sites and along Forest Service roads beginning October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2020.

NVUM is done every five years to update information previously gathered, as well as to look at recreation trends over time. The information collected is useful for Forest planning and provides the ANF's managers with an estimate of how many people recreate on the Forest and what activities they engage in while here.

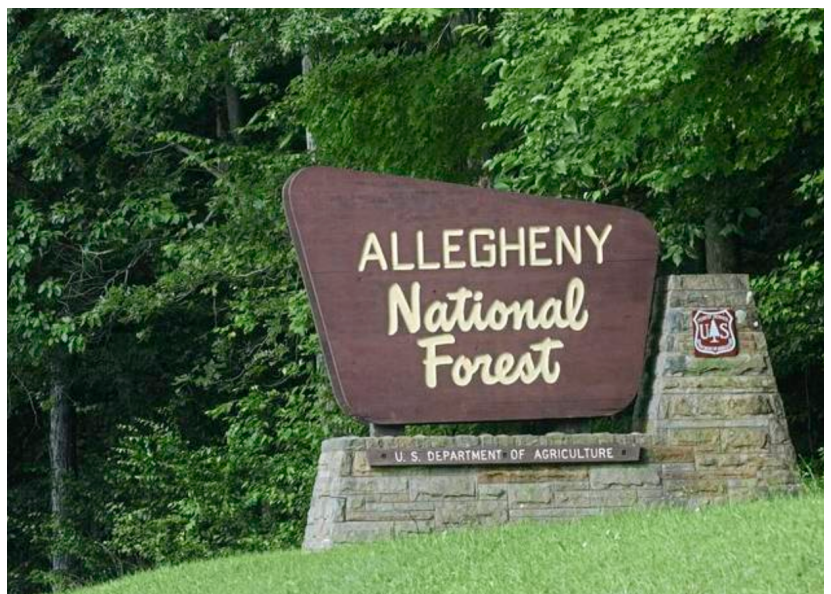
The NVUM data is also useful to local visitor bureaus and community tourism planning in understanding how those visitors to the national forest impact local economies.

Beginning October 1, 2019, national forest visitors will see ANF contracted employees wearing bright orange vests standing near signs that say, "Traffic Survey Ahead." They will be working in all kinds of adverse weather conditions waiting to talk to you, so please pull over for an interview.

All interviews will be conducted by well-trained interviewers and they will want to know about your visit on the national forest. Each interview will last between eight to fifteen minutes.

All information given is confidential and the survey is voluntary.

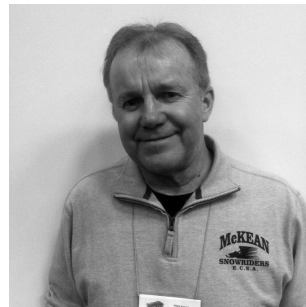
