Reminders:

- All clubs were recently sent a Club Survey to complete. PSSA needs this information to update club information. We use this data to show what the various clubs do to maintain trails and promote snowmobile recreation. We cannot continue to support clubs who do not provide this backup data. PSSA is responsible for the use of all grant funds. (If your club did not receive this survey or you need another link to it please call Kathy Woolever ASAP at the Palmyra Office.) If you have any questions please call me. Leave a message if I do not answer. Everyone's information is important to the future of our sport. Data talks in Washington and Harrisburg. Your cooperation is appreciated. If you need the survey please email us at member@pasnow.org.
- I have been told that several clubs are making a concerted effort to promote PSSA to their members. Clubs have benefited from the PSSA mini-grants totaling over \$500,000. Even if your club does not maintain trails they do have access to the thousands of miles of trails that are maintained by clubs. Your support of PSSA is needed to continue programs that support trails.
- Travis Mathna, Roger Auker, Kathy Woolever and Committee are hard at work promoting the annual PA Powersports Show. Your help is needed to encourage local dealers to participate as a vendor or advertise for the event. This Show helps pay for trails and miscellaneous expenses. Blizzard is once again sponsoring two trailers. A Can Am 450 4x4 ATV has been donated by the dealers via the efforts of Roger Auker. More tickets are available by contacting the Palmyra Office. Volunteers should contact Travis Mathna for information.

- Terry Wood, Keystone Snowmobiler Chair, is asking for articles/pictures for the Keystone Snowmobiler. This is a free opportunity to promote your club/trails. There is also ad space in both the Keystone Snowmobiler and our website: www.pasnow.org to advertise to a much larger internet audience. Contact Kathy Woolever at the Palmyra Office for details.
- Not everyone has internet access. It would help PSSA keep in contact with those members if you would take the time to print a copy of your Keystone Snowmobiler and give it to them. Your generosity is greatly appreciated.
- The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources has experienced a large turnover of personnel in the last several years. Very few ride snowmobiles. Therefore, it is more important for members to contact their local representatives and explain the benefits/needs of snowmobile recreation. It would help the snowmobile recreation program immensely if you would take the time to be in contact with those who vote on recreation issues. Thank you.

The process to appoint Lisa Vallimont as the Grant Administrator for PSSA is now complete. All questions concerning current grants should be directed to Lisa at: 1v051066@gmail.com Lisa will be contacting clubs after I have signed a contract with the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and a budget is approved. The time-line for this part of the process is six to eight weeks. Start planning for your trail needs now.

Clubs will be given a chart which details the totals each club has received for grants. This chart shows the amount of grants given to each club and total volunteer hours. Club volunteers and PSSA membership should be proud of the work and commitment these figures represent. What is not on this chart is the amount of money PSSA memberships cover to make these grants possible. PSSA is a business and must meet its contractual obligations. PSSA depends on memberships, ticket sales, and volunteers for the Power Sport Show, promotion of PSSA on website/Facebook, articles for the Keystone Snowmobiler, donations and active Regional Directors. PSSA Board will be discussing what needs to be done to ensure the continuation of the mini-grant program. Please discuss with your club how you can increase your support. Thank you for your cooperation.

WINTER OUTLOOK

HOW COLD?

The Farmers' Almanac, which provides 16 months of weather forecasts for 7 zones in one compact book, is predicting that the worst of the bitterly cold winter conditions will affect areas east of the Rockies all the way to the Appalachians.

BUCKLE... ER BUNDLE UP!

The biggest drop—with the most freefalling, frigid temperatures—is forecasted to take hold from the northern Plains into the Great Lakes. The Northeast, including the densely populated corridor running from Washington to Boston, will experience colder-than-normal temperatures for much of the upcoming winter. Only the western third of the country will see near-normal winter temperatures, which means fewer shivers for them. Find out how cold it will be where you live!

WHEN IS IT GOING TO GET COLD?

According to the Farmers' Almanac's winter prediction, the coldest outbreak of the season should arrive during the final week of January and last through the beginning of February.

2019 USED SLED (And Other Toys) CORRAL

Another year has gone by and we are getting ready for the annual PSSA Powersports Show, again this year at the Lebanon Expo Center.

If you are not familiar with how you can sell your equipment at the Powersports Show, here is a quick explanation: Bring your equipment, park outside, enter the building and walk to the Used Sled Corral table. Fill out a 3-part carbon-less form for each item. You can save time by printing a sample form from the website (www.papowersports.com) and filling in all the info before coming to the show. Then transfer the info to the 3-part form. Pay the fee for each unit. Our friendly volunteers will then unload sleds and move trailers into the building. We do the rest!

On the form you will list the selling price and indicate if you are firm or negotiable on that price. You will list a 'bottom line' price if you choose negotiable. Our volunteers will not reveal the 'bottom line' to a potential buyer, but will attempt to get the highest price for you. If we sell your unit, we collect the money and hold it for you. Machines or money must be claimed no later than 5 pm on Sunday, an hour after the show closes.

Those machines that are not sold during the show are often sold later, as a result of someone seeing it at the show. They tell another person in the days following the show, that person calls for info, and the deal is made!

For current PSSA members, the fee for each unit (sled, trailer, motorcycle, or ATV) placed in the Corral will be \$25. Pay the fee when you arrive with your machine.

For the non-members, we will not require that they join PSSA, but the fee for them will be \$60 per unit. If they wish to join, they will save ten bucks by doing so, as the consignment fee will be \$25, and the membership is \$25, for a total of only \$50.

For those persons buying a unit, PSSA members can make a purchase with no extra charge, nonmembers will be charged a fee of \$35.

We expect most non-members to recognize the value of PSSA membership and make a decision to join (so they can save the extra ten bucks!). If a person does not wish to join, PSSA gets the ten dollars!

One very important feature of the Used Sled Corral is the great group of volunteers that make it happen. Over the years we have gotten to know a number of fine folks who help at the Corral. Some help for a few hours and others help many hours. Each and every one is appreciated; we can't do it without you. Snowmobile Facts

Snowmobilers come in all ages. The average snowmobiler however, is 45 years old.

The average snowmobile snowmobiler last season rode 1,500miles/2,414kilometers(a 20% increase in ridership compared to 2018.) The number of miles ridden, on average, is dependent on snow cover, so we will see if Mother Nature brings us more days of snow for riding this season.

Many snowmobilers belong to a club and participate in many of their club's events. Clubs hold great riding events, great parties, and are made up of wonderful people that become great friends. Join a club and have a great time!!!

About 50% of the people that snowmobile, trailer their snowmobile to their riding area. The other 50% ride from their home or cabin.

Snowmobiling is a family friendly activity. Most of al lthose responding to surveys report that they snowmobile with family and with friends and with club members.

Snowmobilers are outdoor recreationists all year around. Following is a list of recreational activities that snowmobilers participate in when they aren't out riding:

- 60% go ATV Riding
- 57% go Camping
- 54% go Fishing
- 53% go Boating
- I38% go Hunting
- 35% go Hiking
- 32% go Motorcycle Riding
- 26% go Golfing
- 17% go Personal Watercraft Riding 15% go Downhill Skiing
- 15% do other recreational Activities

Approximately 79% of the snowmobilers are male.

Snowmobilers are a big part of the winter economic engine by spending an average of \$3349 each year going snowmobiling, traveling to their snowmobiling spot, and food, gas, and lodging. In many places of North America, snowmobilers pay the bills for people involved in the Winter Tourism Industries and related businesses



SNOWMOBILING DO'S & DON'TS

SNOWMOBILING DO'S

- Know the local hazards and forecasted weather conditions.
- Understand the importance of protective equipment and proper clothing while riding a snowmobile.
- Be alert and constantly scan the trail or riding area for other snowmobiles, trail users, and hazards.
- Ride defensively, be courteous, and use common sense.
- Follow the rules of the road and abide by all trail signs.
- Steer clear of restricted areas and respect environmentally sensitive areas.
- Know the operational characteristics of the snowmobile, along with its capacities and limitations: vehicle's range based upon normal fuel capacity and consumption, stopping ability/distance, maneuverability/steering capability, ability in deep snow, ability on steep side slopes, etc.
- Respect the rights of all other winter recreationists.
- Obey posted speed limits.
- Know the assumed risks and potential consequences of careless or reckless behavior while riding a snowmobile, including the potential for fines or injury.

SNOWMOBILING DON'TS

- Do not operate at high speeds, especially when near houses, buildings, livestock, wildlife, trailheads, or other recreationists.
- Do not use alcohol or drugs.
- Do not engage in reckless, careless, or inappropriate behavior.
- Do not overload a snowmobile or ride double unless the snowmobile is designed for 2 passengers.
- Do not get too close to other snowmobiles or other recreationists.
- Do not operate the snowmobile in areas with limited snow cover or on bare ground.
- Do not disturb wildlife or livestock.
- Do not ignore sudden changes in weather conditions.
- Do not disobey local, state/provincial, or federal snowmobile rules, regulations, and policies.
- Do not allow the snowmobile rental unit to be operated by anyone who has not completed the required rental orientation, training, and rental agreement documentation.
- Do not disobey rental company guidelines, instructions, or policies.
