Ask when they will schedule a public input meeting. Put your comments/concerns in writing. Take time to do it now – complaining later won't help. Check out the DCNR website for parks.

Mini-grant charts which list all the grants awarded in the last several years are being given to clubs. Advertise your club and PSSA by having a chart placed in local businesses. The information on the chart is useful to demonstrate what clubs do to maintain trails and it also shows what PSSA members do to support the clubs. Club volunteer hours are also listed. We need more members to join clubs and PSSA.

### **PENNSYLVANIA STATE PARKS WELCOME WINTER VISITORS WITH TRAILS, ACTIVITIES**

With the official arrival of winter, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Secretary Cindy Adams Dunn is reminding outdoors enthusiasts that Pennsylvania's state forest and park systems again are rolling out the welcome mat for winter visitors intent on enjoying cold-weather, outdoor fun.

"As the temperatures turn seasonable and snow and ice accumulate in some areas, we extend an invitation to head to woodlands, lakes, and trails and enter a new world of outdoor excitement and adventure," Dunn said. "We invite visitors to try sledding at a nearby state park or stroll on a forest trail and enjoy the beauty and peace winter landscapes offer. For others, snowmobile and ATV trails have opened, and hunters and anglers will be heading to our state forests and parks for late-season hunting and ice fishing."

Following the Dec. 14, close of Pennsylvania's regular deer hunting season, snowmobiling began Dec. 15 and will close April 1 in state forests and parks where conditions permit.

This season, snowmobile riders in Pennsylvania's state forests and parks have access to 3,000 miles of marked joint-use state forest roads, closed roads, and trails in 18 of the state's 20 state forest districts and in 32 state parks. Winter ATV trails stretching more than 170 miles in seven state forest districts also opened Dec. 14.

When winter weather cooperates, state parks and forests are the scene of coordinated winter festivals with games, dog-sled races, sleigh rides, and fun competitions for families.

For the cross-country skiing enthusiast, more than 330 miles of marked cross-country ski trails are offered on Pennsylvania's more than 2.3 million acres of state forestland. Also available are nearly 400 miles of groomed and ungroomed cross-country ski trails in 73 state parks..

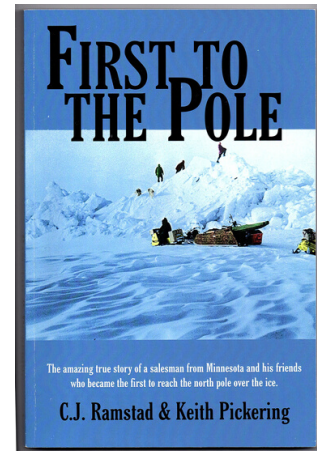

# book review

## **First To The Pole** **A Book Review by Henry Hartman**

Who were the first persons to reach the North Pole by surface travel? For decades, history gave the credit to Robert Peary in 1909. That claim has proven to be “fake news”, and a 2011 book written mostly by the late C.J. Ramstad and completed by Keith Pickering, tells the true story of Ralph Plaisted and his 1968 North Pole Expedition. This group of hearty men used snowmobiles in their attempt and success of reaching the real North ‘Pole’, proven by a US Air Force C-135 aircraft when overflying the party.



One of my Christmas presents this past December was a copy of the book entitled “First To The Pole”. I’m honored to say that author C.J. Ramstad was a personal friend of mine, and I was privileged to know him for more than 20 years before his tragic death from a traffic accident in 2007. I had the pleasure of traveling with ‘CJ’ on several occasions; we roomed together during a Snowmobile Media Council ride at Laramie, Wyoming and enjoyed many International Snowmobile Congresses together. CJ graciously photographed my proposal to Peggy in 1987 at the Eagle River World’s Championship Derby Track!

Following CJ’s untimely death, historian Keith Pickering sorted through dozens of files, paper and electronic, that CJ had accumulated and had the finished project copyrighted and released in 2011. Keith has done a superb job of completing “the amazing true story of a salesman from Minnesota and his friends who became the first to reach the north pole over the ice.”



## book review (cont.)

While I encourage you to get a copy of this exciting book and read it for yourself, imagine using 1968 Ski-Doo single cylinder two-stroke powered snowmobiles to travel roughly 500 miles from land over the arctic ice pack, which is constantly, slowly, moving and cracking, heaving into ridges, and leaving open water between its flows. The machines had primitive bogie-wheel suspensions and each towed a large supply sled. Insulated tents, food, fuel, heaters, and other necessities had to be taken along. Weather presented a considerable challenge, much of the trip had temperatures in the 40-to-65 degree BELOW zero range. When it did warm up to a balmy 20-below, a storm moved in that trapped the explorers in their tents for a week!

Add to this the support logistics of replenishing fuel, food, and providing communications equipment. And all of this taking place well before modern GPS navigation was available. Problems with weather and mechanical breakdowns made for even more challenges for the twin-engine Otter aircraft that was the lifeline for the party. For everyone involved, clothing to endure the arctic temperatures was nothing like we have today. These men were REAL snowmobilers!

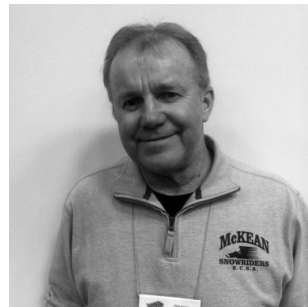

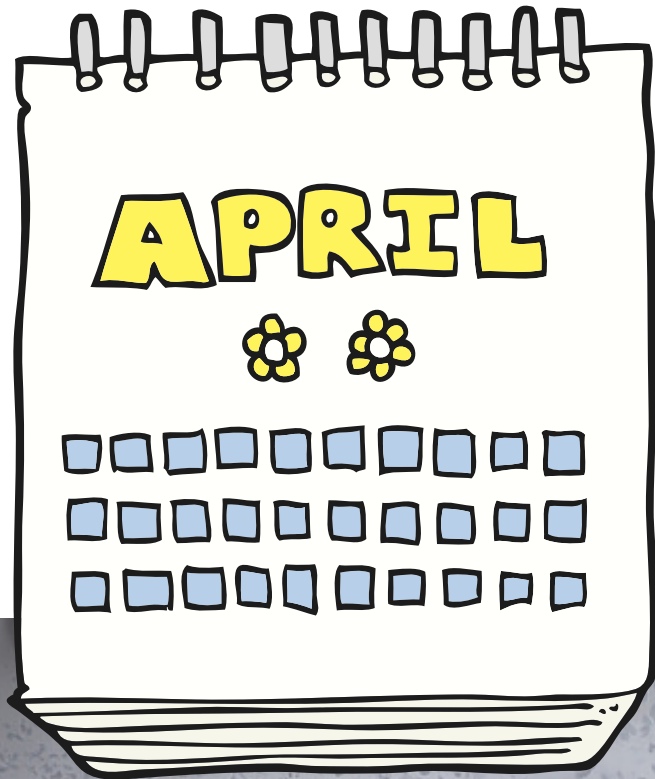
