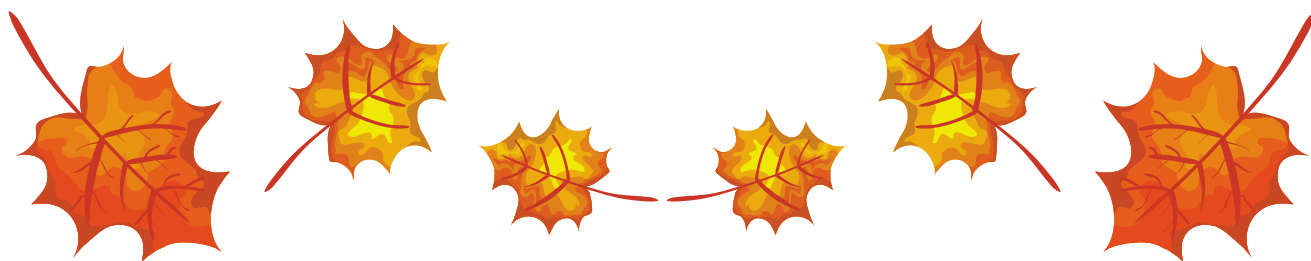

TRAIL WORK TIME

As the days are getting shorter and the nights are getting colder, snowmobilers thoughts turn towards the upcoming snowmobile season. This thought pattern is encouraged and reinforced by the heightened activity of the local snowmobile clubs and their Trail Work activity.

With the possibility that we'll all be limited to only being able to ride in PA this year due to the Pandemic, learning what new's and improved in PA takes on a greater relevance. If the Canadian border stays closed and all the sledders normally heading to the far north are forced to remain and ride in the states, places like NY, MI, and ME will lack accommodations for additional influx of riders. PA here we come.

Facing the possibility of limited riding options for this winter it's good to hear that many local PA Clubs are busy maintaining existing snowmobile trails as well as constructing new one. On existing trails brush is being cleared, wet spots eliminated, trail surfaces are being repaired and bridges are being reinforced, reconstructed or are being replaced. This year it's exciting to see the number of new trails being constructed. Trail construction is really a year round activity that involves a lot of planning to secure land owner permission, trail path layout, funding, and equipment and material. Local PA Clubs do all of these activities with their only support typically being PSSA Grants. With new trail construction and the actual building of the trail, there's often pressure to get the trail completed before the riding season starts in December and the hunting season starts in October. Many times trail work activity is limited in hunting season to just Sundays. And it may be limited even more in coming years due to Sunday hunting several times a year. So we see a flurry (excuse the pun) of activity in September and October.

Local Club volunteers make up most of the Trail Work efforts. Many times local business's support the volunteers by providing equipment or materials, all thanks to the club volunteers working to secure this help. Without the efforts of local clubs, including volunteers and financial assistance by all the club members and PSSA, we wouldn't have the trails we have today.

PENNSYLVANIA SNOWMOBILE DEALER HISTORY 1960'S-70'S

In early 2017, we started putting together the history of people and businesses that sold snowmobiles "back in the good old days". After starting with York County, the momentum was already going and we expanded it state-wide.

Snowmobiles started to become popular in the early 1960's. By 1970, there were about 130 different manufacturers, and there were more than 265 brand names of snowmobiles being sold! Did you know there were at least 6 (six) manufacturers of snowmobiles right here in our state? The most prolific company built more than 48,000 machines in a 5 year span!

Snowmobiles could be bought at small "mom & pop" shops, (often in garages attached to a residence), as well as at large stores such as Sears, Montgomery Ward, and JC Penney. Several farm equipment manufacturers and many marine companies (boats and motors) got into the snowmobile business.

During 1973-75, the so-called "energy crisis" combined with several poor snow winters spelled the end of many of these manufacturers and brands.

Today, there are four (4) major manufacturers of snowmobiles. That number has remained constant since the 1985 model year. We are interested in the places that sold snowmobiles not later than 1982-84 or so.

We are attempting to record the history of as many of the "old time" dealers that sold snowmobiles as we can. We have them listed in alphabetical order by Counties, then alphabetically by Town names, followed by the brand(s) sold. We show the total number of old-time dealers for each county, followed by the number of dealers existing today, if known.

There are 67 counties in PA, and so far we have been able to collect information for about 51 of them. Counties that we have NO records from include: Armstrong, Beaver, Bedford, Butler, Cameron, Crawford, Delaware, Fayette, Greene, Indiana, Lawrence, Montour, Susquehanna, Venango, Washington, and Wyoming.

Wasn't this a spectacular fall? How beautiful. Here at Glendale Lake SMC we're looking forward to a spectacular good old fashion winter as well!

Greetings. A lot going on at the club right now. The financial report from our club Picnic and membership drive is looking good so far. Revenue was down a little bit without the Basket Raffle but membership numbers were good with 167 members and 7 business memberships, sponsorships were good, and expenses were reasonable, so a successful event. If you haven't sent in your 2021 dues yet, please do that ASAP and save us the expense of another mailing. And if you're riding our trails and not a member yet, please seriously consider joining the club. Financing the trails is not inexpensive with insurance, leases and construction costs. Plus we need membership numbers to carry some weight with local and state legislators as we continue to push for the opening of more trails. Membership is only \$15, about the cost of a quart of snowmobile oil.

Trail discussions were a big topic at the October meeting. Seven trail projects were on the agenda. Since the meeting we constructed the needed access ramps to our RR crossing, improved the historic Stage Coach Trail and held a State Park trail clean up. DCNR added decking to the Shomo Trail Bridge that we constructed so it's ready for the club to complete the access ramps and railings. Antis Township donated mulch for the Stage Coach Trail and Jimmy Wiekert Excavating and Landscaping donated ½ the ties for the Railroad crossing approaches. And as always, Club volunteers did a great job on these projects and enjoyed some snowmobiling comradery while doing it. If you want to learn the trails or discover the best places to ride, volunteer on one of these trail projects. The construction of an additional three new trails are in various stages of developments. One set back is that it doesn't look like the trail from the State Park to Patton Sportsmen's will be open for this winter. Stay tuned.



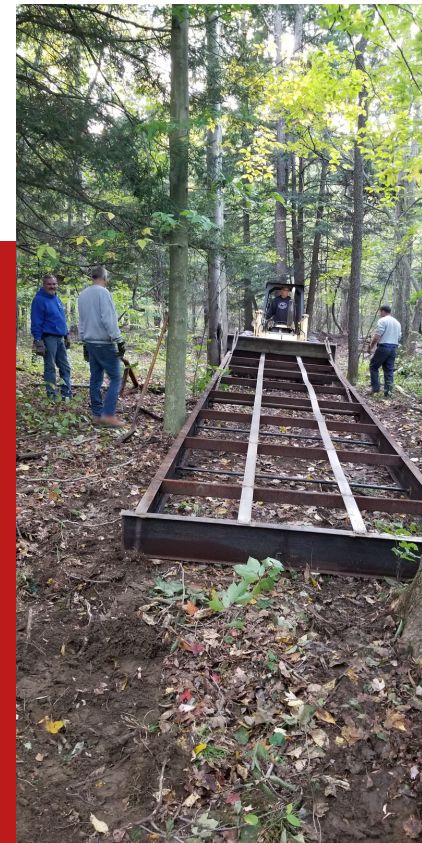
GLENDALE LAKE SMC (CONT)

DUTCH TRAIL CUTTERS TO CONDUCT ANNUAL SAFETY COURSE

The Dutch Trail Cutters Snowmobile Club's annual youth Pennsylvania snowmobile safety course will be conducted on Saturday, December 5, 2020 at the Bellegrove Fire Company, 1743 Blacks Bridge Road, Annville, PA 17003.

Pennsylvania's Snowmobile Law requires youngsters between the ages of 10 to 15 to earn a safety certificate before they may lawfully operate a snowmobile in the state, except upon lands owned or leased by their parent or legal guardian.

The goal of the course, which was developed and is administered by the PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, is to develop safe attitudes and practices in all keystone state snowmobilers. Student manuals and workbooks will be utilized to illustrate the sport's basic principles and safety concepts. Class participants qualify for their certificate by completing their workbooks and achieving a score of 80% or better on the final examination.

Course instructors include Rich Ebersole of Cornwall, PA; Dutch Trail Cutters Snowmobile Club member Henry Hartman of Hanover, PA; Harrison Langley, Jr. of Palmyra, PA; and Lew Stoms of Hampstead, MD.

The team of DCNR-certified instructors conducting this course have 174 years of combined, varied snowmobiling experience around North America and the world. So, come prepared to have fun and learn in-person from experienced snowmobilers that have been there, done that, and most likely rode there!

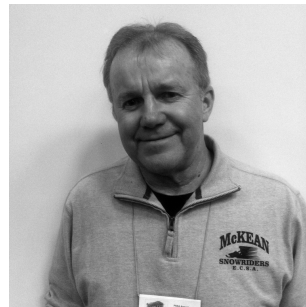
