

GETTING AWAY TO PA

Many sledders are wondering what the winter will bring, both weather wise and pandemic wise. If the weather cooperates but the Pandemic doesn't. And if the Northern USA Boarder remains closed and all those riders that usually head to Canada now head to NY, MI and ME, accommodations could fill up quickly in those areas. We may be limited to PA riding. Fortunately we can still get away for a couple of days to the Potter-Tioga – Grand Canyon Area, a great place to get away for a few days and ride. If your camp in ANF doesn't get snow or the lake effect doesn't hit Laurel Highlands or RB Winters doesn't get hit by that Nor'easters, consider driving an additional 1 to 3 hours to reach this area. Due to its higher elevation snow can often be found here when the rest of Pa is still brown. How do you know if there's snow, check out the Pennsylvania Riding Still Exist article in the March Keystone Snowmobiler, go to the last page of the article for tips on finding riding and snow conditions:

GETTING AWAY IN PA (CONT)

Now let's plan a trip: 2-3 day Trips in PA in Grand Canyon Area, 2 – 3 hour drive, good to great accommodations, good food and glorious trails:

- Stay in Wellsboro and then trailer 6 miles to Colton Point to get on the PA Grand Canyon Trails. Very scenic and great groomed trials. Stay at the Hotel or Lodge in Wellsboro: https://pennwells.com/home/welcome/. You'll love the quaint town of Wellsboro, shopping and things other than snowmobiling to do. Once on the trails, stop at the Pa Grand Canyon SMC Club for Gas and Food. Or go approximately 10 miles to God's Country SMC for Breakfast on Saturday from 8 -11 it is a tradition. On trail Lodging is Colton Point Motel https://www.facebook.com/coltonpointmotel/
- Stay just south of Little Pine SP and then trailer a few miles to lower Grand Canyon and Hyner Trails. Stay at Happy Acre Lodge or Cabins: www.happyacresresort.net/lodge.html or Waterville Tavern and Inn: http://watervilletavern.com/ Food at Fin, Fur and Feather, and Mountain Top Inn isn't far. This is pretty far south in Lycoming Co, so double check the snow conditions or drive 10 miles north to hit snow in PA Grand Canyon area
- Stay at Slate Run. Ride north to PA Grand Canyon. Stay at the http://www.hotel-manor.com/ Google it to get much better pictures of the place. Stop across the street at the Orvis Wolfe's General Store. Trail access and gas. Just a little north of Hyner. If you'd like to give a Bed and Breakfast a try then : http://pavisnet.com/cedarruninn/features.html costs a little more but includes dinner and breakfast.
- And half way between Ole Bull and Hyner is the Black Forest Inn. Make sure you request a King Suite. http://www.theblackforestinnpa.com/Lodging.html We like the food here. Ride north or south, or both depending on trail conditions. Lots of short or long loops out of here.
- Another possible option is staying at the Hyner Mt Snowmobile Club Bunk Room. I'm pretty sure they allow guests, call the club to confirm. https://sites.google.com/site/hynermountainsnowmobileclub/home

With good snow conditions all of the above could be a great two or three day trip with riding every day due to the short truck ride. Some lodging is trail access and some requires a short trailer ride. I used the Hyner Map for research. Early reservations may be required. This area is well mapped and fairly well signed and trails in PA are as beautiful as anywhere.

ADOPTING A TRAIL

About 6 years ago my wife and I and another couple were riding the designated snowmobile trails at Prince Gallitzin State Park. One of the trails we came across had a huge tree laying across the trail. We had no saws, or other means of getting around the tree, so we turned around and headed back to the trailers. As we were loading the sleds up, a park ranger drove past and asked us "How's the riding today?" I walked over to him and told him the story of the tree. I asked him if we could take a chainsaw back and cut it so we could continue riding into another area, extending our riding by a few more miles. The ranger agreed and said we could cut it away. He also explained a program that DCNR parks have. This program was called Adopt-A-Trail.

Adopt-A Trail is a program through DCNR that registered volunteers can "adopt" a trail or trails. This involves, cleaning up litter, cutting back growth, clearing trees and other trail maintenance projects. Park staff approves projects and allows the group to work in an independent way. The group will coordinate with park staff to gain access to tools and equipment. <<<

I told the ranger I would look into this project and bring it up at our next snowmobile club meeting. The club agreed to get involved with the Adopt-A-Trail program. I went to the DCNR volunteer website and registered the club and contacted the park for our first trail cleaning. https://www.volunteers.dcnr.pa.gov/index.aspx



ADOPTING A TRAIL

The benefits that have been achieved from joining this program have gone well beyond just clearing trails. over past years we have had a great relationship with the park manager and staff. We have adopted over 30 miles of trails that wind throughout the park. In order to clear these in a timely manner the park lets us use ATV's and SXS. We have built many bridges over ravines that were always flowing in the winter, filled low areas with shale and drainage pipes and always are clearing blow downs. In addition to trail maintenance the park has asked the club to join them in their annual "winter fest". At the festival we promote safe snowmobiling, show maps of trails throughout Pennsylvania, and offer snowmobile rides for guest that sign waivers. Most of the guest have never rode a sled. Some have snowmobiles but did not know of all the areas available to ride. We are also granted a booth at the annual Apple Cider Festival every year, and last year the park coordinated with our club to shuttle attendees via pontoons boats. The park has also applied for grants for snowmobile trail development and maintenance. We are currently developing a new multi-use trail that will add an additional five miles to their snowmobile trail system. This project should be ready for travel this winter.

I feel that the Glendale Lake Snowmobile Club has benefitted a lot more from the Adopt-A-Trail than just cutting a tree down over a trail nearly six years ago.
