HAPPY LABOR DAY! THINK SNOW!

After a very hot summer and rain snowmobile clubs are returning to their club meetings and trail work. It is difficult to image that in a few short months we will have colder temperatures and snow.

Clubs have been using the PSSA mini-grant funds to improve the trails. Thank you to all our volunteers for their planning and work to make our trails safe. We cannot function without our volunteers.

The clubs will be informed of any remaining money in the grant program as always. In the meantime work to finish your projects and return your information to Lisa Vallimont. The remaining checks will be distributed as soon as all club project documentation is received.

Funds are scarce so clubs should plan ahead to make the best use of monies for future projects and equipment needs.

At the request of the State Legislature DCNR implemented an ATV Pilot project. The 2021 ATV Regional Trail Connector Pilot area spans Potter and Tioga counties, but does not include the entirety of both counties. This project includes many townships, municipalities, state forest, joint-use roads, private property and limited snowmobile trails etc. As the size suggests this is a mammoth undertaking. Many meetings, research and forming partnerships with a diverse group of stakeholders was implemented by DCNR personnel. The project provides for comments from stakeholders and a report is due in 2023.

ATV riding opportunities within this pilot area are as follows:

- 208 miles of township roads currently open to ATV use
- 12 miles of PennDOT-administered roads newly open to ATV use
- 14 miles of state forest roads and trails newly open to ATV use

A similar smaller scale format has been followed by clubs for many years. Now PSSA in cooperation with clubs and private landowners needs to go BIG. There are two areas in Northwestern and Central PA which could potentially benefit the smaller communities. Once the connections are made a snowmobiler could ride and connect with trails in NY, Ohio and PA trails.

Possible projects could include the following:

- Connect the ANF trails with the Kinzua Bridge trail, Lantz Corners, Smethport, Elk State Forest and beyond. The equestrian riders under the leadership of Carolyn Stroup have made it possible for snowmobilers to use the Kinzua trail. They deserve many thanks
- Connect Western PA trails with the ANF trails and Elk State Forest thru Tidioute. The Corry Snowmobile Club has done extensive work in extending the trails in southern Erie and Crawford Counties. Thank you for your hard and dedicated work.

THANK YOU to all who bought tickets for the money raffle. The drawing was held at the beginning of the August Board meeting. Winners are listed elsewhere in the paper.

Congratulations! If you missed the drawing it is recorded. Contact Kathy Woolever at the Palmyra Office for information on it. The volume of tickets showed the value of having a money only raffle. For those of us who did not win (I include myself in that category) WE donated to a good cause.

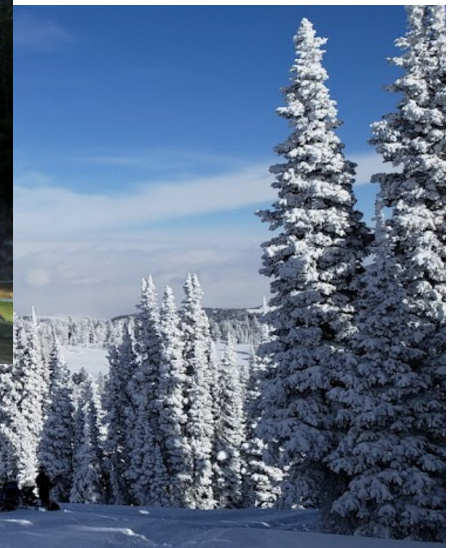
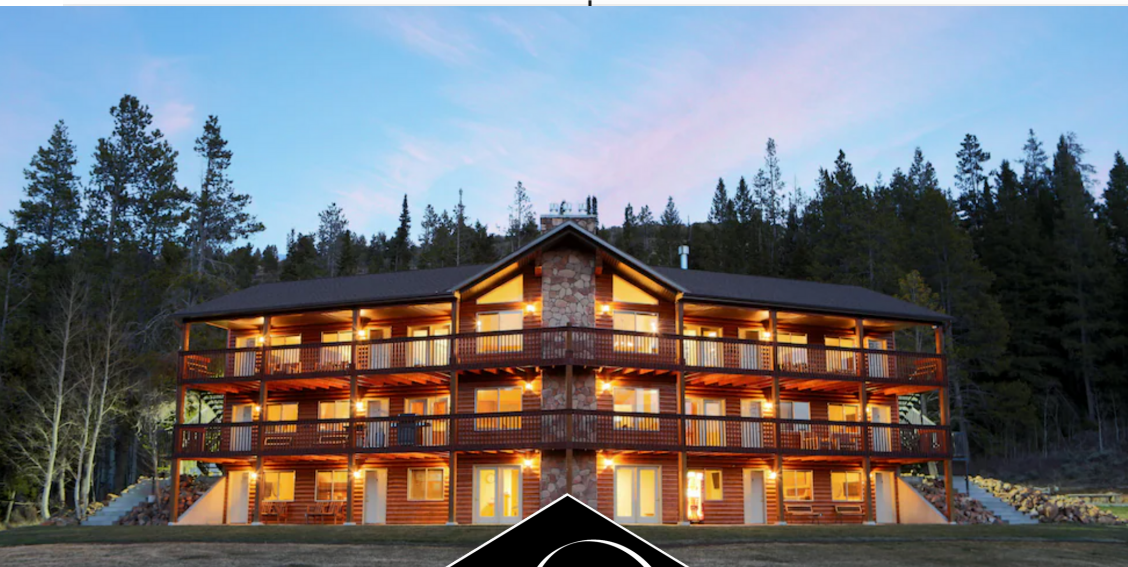

Fall Picnic/Dinner

The Maple Summit Snowmobilers decided to combine the annual summer outdoor picnic and annual fall dinner into one event for 2021. We will be having an outdoor cookout using our chuck wagon that we use for the winter trail-side cookouts.

The club will provide burgers, hotdogs, kielbasa, buns, condiments and soft drinks. Covered dishes are welcomed. Austrian master chef, Harald Kofler, will once again be doing his magic on the grill.

The cookout will be held at Dave McCarty's place located at 164 Bluebird Lane, Rockwood, PA, 15557. Some GPS's take you down back roads that are not a good way to go. Call Dave @ (412) 480-7068 to verify your directions.

Here are the directions: Take Rt 653 South (also called Jim Mountain Road) from Normalsville heading toward New Lexington. After traveling approx. .6 miles (14 minutes) on Route 653 make a left onto Earl Ansel Road which will take you past Kings Mountain Resort. The resort's club house is located approx. .3 miles on the left. From Route 653 you will travel 2.2 miles to the "T" at the top of hill. At this point you will have to make a left or a right, make the right onto Cardinal Lane. Make the 1st left onto Bluebird Lane, go approximately .1 mile, make a right following the gravel road (this is still Bluebird Lane), travel .2 miles, camp on left. If you are going to use a GPS, please double check the route it tells you to take.

At this location, you will be able to see and ask questions about the club's trail maintaining and grooming equipment, including both of our groomers, backhoe, Mule, power tools and trail supplies. Check out the equipment and ask questions. The groomer operators will be there to answer questions about the groomers, how and when the trails are groomed, and other trail issues. Interested in running a groomer? Come check things out.

GLENDALE LAKE SNOWMOBILE CLUB RECEIVES CONSERVATION GROUP VOLUNTEER OF YEAR AWARD

PA State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources announces the recipient of the Group Volunteer of the Year for 2020. This award went to Glendale Lake Snowmobile Club of Patton, PA.

Prince Gallitzin State Park management submitted the nomination. Accomplishments that aided in selection for this award were, significant impact on general public, enhanced the image, prestige, and effectiveness of the Bureau. The following is the statement submitted by the PGSP manager.

In fall of 2018 Prince Gallitzin State Park was notified by Glendale Riding Stables that they were going out of business and would no longer be giving horseback riding on the park trails. 2018 was a very rainy year and horseback riding took a heavy toll on the trail system adjacent to the former Glendale Stables. Overwhelmed by the poor shape which the trails were in and without enough time for park staff to properly rehabilitate the trail system, the trails were left untouched. In late 2019 the Glendale Lake Snowmobile Club (GLSC), led by Rob Housley and Paul Simendinger, decided to take on this massive project of rerouting and rehabilitating the trails formerly known as the Glendale Riding Stable Trails and constructing a new connecting trail segment from Slate Lick Cove and Marina Road.

The new trail reroute was mapped, flagged out and approved when the pandemic related closures hit Pennsylvania. Instead of using it as an excuse to delay the project, it had an opposite effect on club members. Working independently and in small, safe groups the GLSC was able to make progress day after day and week after week on the project. All the while, the GLSC members were keeping in constant communication with park management and maintenance staff. They thought of creative ideas in how to repurpose the materials the park had on hand and in their scrap piles to make the trail sustainable and long lasting.



GLENDALE LAKE SNOWMOBILE CLUB RECEIVES CONSERVATION GROUP VOLUNTEER OF YEAR AWARD

After approximately six months of work and over 600 volunteer hours, the trail was in place and ready to be used by hikers, mountain bikers, equestrian riders and snowmobilers. The new trail was named Shomo Run Trail after the creek that it follows. It is 2.0 mile long and it connects Slate Lick Cove and Marina Road to the Noel Run Connector trail, which allows hikers and riders to access 17.1 miles of interconnected trails at Prince Gallitzin State Park. The most amazing aspect of this volunteer project is that the GLSC has put in an enormous amount of effort to create a trail after two consecutive years of winters with poor snow conditions. They were proud to be able to make this long-lasting trail in a State Park and they're hopeful that the trail will be in place for many generations of trail users and snowmobiles.

The GLSC has been an active volunteer group for the past six years. They have adopted and completed trail maintenance and improvements on many of the park`s trails over the years. The reroute, rehabilitation and construction of the Shomo Run Trail went far beyond any effort that they have taken on in the past. The sheer number of volunteer hours as well as innovation solutions to working during a pandemic with purchasing restrictions was amazing. Their dedication to the creation of a sustainable trail system is to be commended and will be appreciated by park users for decades to come...

PSSA TRAIL COMMITTEE UPDATE

As a result of the PSSA Survey of all Snowmobilers last winter, PSSA has taken several action steps to serve the state's snowmobilers as indicated by survey responses. As a result of this survey the PSSA Trails Committee was formed. The committee's vision and guiding principles are below.

The vision of the trail committee is to improve the snowmobiling experience in PA. This is being guided by the PSSA Survey of Snowmobilers and Snowmobile Clubs done the winter of 2020-2021.

We can accomplish this by being a source of information for clubs looking to improve their trails. We will work to promote trail connections and conditions on both public and private trails to increase riding opportunities in Pennsylvania. It should be our goal to continue and improve our relationships with DCNR, the Allegheny National Forest (ANF), Snowmobile Clubs, Private Land Owners, PennDot, the PA Game Commission, and the ATV Community.

Action Items:

Assist Clubs - Manual for Trail building and signage was talked about. It is thought that DCNR might have these. Land Owners Agreements, RYLA, Game Commission Agreements. Grant Writing, and other training. Funding is also a component of this.

New Trails and Connector Trails – How is this facilitated at the local and State levels

PSSA TRAIL COMMITTEE UPDATE

Trail Conditions – How are they reported? Improved? Plowing of joint use roads. Regular grooming and reporting of the grooming. Are Trail Cams still a viable option?

PennDot – Using PennDot right of ways, State Roads, and Road Shoulders for Trails was discussed. The ATV groups are already working on this. We will watch how this progresses. Bob Kirshner the motorized representative from Conservation and Natural Resources Advisory Council (CNRAC) also mentioned this in his Annual Meeting Report.

Trail Maps and Trail conditions, Signage - Rob Housley will contact New York and other states to get information on the cell phone trail app. Rob will also contact the North Central Planning Commission to see what's happening with the Pennsylvania mapping project. Troy Withers the PA DCNR Motorized Recreation Program Specialist has requested a meeting on this topic.

DCNR Conversations – The plowing of groomed trails, Vehicular Traffic on groomed trails, Snowmobile Safety training, Grooming, Connector Trails, See Maps and Condition above,

PA Game Commission – Improve working relationship.

Worth Exploring - CNRAC 15 Point Motorized Requests, New DCNR Motorized Report, ?



800 Snowmobile Hotline Eliminated!

PA DCNR announced this summer that the 800 Snowmobile Hotline has been discontinued. Discussions this spring at DCNR and with some representatives of the snowmobile community indicated that the Hot Line wasn't being utilized like it had in the past and it wasn't really serving the needs of the snowmobiling community. That coupled with issues in the technology of the program indicated that it was time to sunset this offering. The online DCNR Trailreports and SnowConditions will continue at this time. A Study Group within DCNR and PSSA is looking for some alternatives or options regarding reporting snow conditions and possibly mapping in the future. Please let your PSSA regional director know your thoughts on this.

PSSA SNOW ANGEL

For nearly twenty (20) years, the generosity of PSSA's members in purchasing annual raffle tickets and making donations has enabled the Association to contribute nearly \$200,000 to aid in the care of children with special needs.

Through PSSA's Snow Angels Children's Charity, grants (up to \$500 per child under the age of 18) are available throughout the State to aid families with children having severe medical or physical problems.

This year PSSA helped out Tracey and Andy Collins after their two year old Bea was rushed from Altoona to UPMC Children's Hospital in Pittsburgh in early January. Bea spent a significant amount of time in the hospital. She's been diagnosed with systemic juvenile idiopathic arthritis with MAS in addition to the possible hospital infection from surgery on her ankle. MAS can be a life threatening disease in children.

Bea's parents both took a month off of work to be at Bea's side while her 4 year old brother Teddy stayed at home in Altoona with family. He made occasional visits to the hospital to see his sister and parents. Andy is retired Army National Guard with service in the Middle East conflict and now works full time as a prison guard. Tracey works full time in the family business.

We wish Bea the very best as she works to heal and recover.

Greetings to everyone from the Glendale Lake SMC. Activities are ramping up as we head into the fall and winter seasons.

The big, immediate news is our annual Fall Picnic and Sled Give Away, The date will be September 25th at the Patton Sportsman Club from 12:00 to 4:00pm. We have a donated a vintage Arctic Cat and two children's battery operated ATVs to be given away to several lucky members in attendance. Attendance at the picnic and chances on the snowmobile are free to members who renew their membership for 2022. Additional information on Facebook. Trail work continues on multiple fronts. We are in the process of securing our work permit for on the State Game Lands for the trails going east. RJ Corman railroad has been paid \$861.49, our annual bill for the Railroad Crossing. Several washouts occurred on the Shomo Run Trail at Prince Gallitzin State Park and the washouts have been repaired. Those repairs required the replacement of some slate using excavating equipment. Discussions continue on our Phase II trail with lots of work going on behind the scenes as new partnerships are being explored. The club has voted on expanding those relationships as needed to make progress with this trail. A \$60,000 Study may be needed to move forward with this trail. Dates for the Fall Clean Up of the Prince Gallitzin State Park Trails will be announced soon. That's a super fun day that many of the club members look forward to.

Another fun club activity is during the Prince Gallitzin State Park Apple Cider Festival. Again this year we'll have a booth in the festival and we'll also be providing Pontoon Boat Shuttle service from some of the alternate parking areas. This is a club fund raiser and great time. Volunteers are needed.

It was reported that the Bridge that our club donated to the Portage Area Park and Trail has been picked up by Boy Scouts and other volunteers. The group is very appreciative of the donation because it not only serves as a bridge but it also serves as a local match for their state funding. And the Club Family that has stored the bridge for over two years also appreciates having it out of their yard. Thanks to everyone involved in this.

It's reported that our Club Insurance will increase by about 20% this year and we're awaiting the renewal notice.

At the August Club meeting there was some discussion of the ATV Pilot Program currently being undertaken in Potter and Tioga Counties. Our Club will continue to track the Study.

Snowmobiling in the News

Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) Secretary Cindy Adams Dunn announced the department soon will begin accepting applications for grants aiding snowmobile- and all-terrain vehicle-related projects.

"Pennsylvania is home to thousands of avid snowmobile and ATV riding enthusiasts," Dunn said. "Through these projects, we hope to improve upon and expand opportunities for worthy projects across the commonwealth."

Applications will be accepted beginning August 2 through September 30. Applications will only be accepted electronically through [DCNR's online grant application system](#).

No match is required for this funding; however, applications providing matching funding will be given additional consideration.

Proposed projects eligible for DCNR grants include planning, land acquisition, development, rehabilitation, maintenance, purchase of equipment for maintenance and construction, and development of educational programs related to snowmobile and ATV trails and facilities.

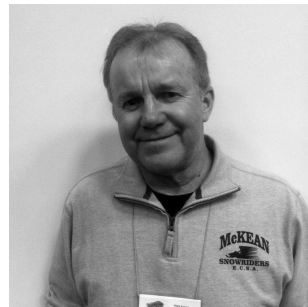
