This situation presents an opportunity for clubs to advertise the benefits of snowmobiling and enjoy the friendships developed in belonging to a club. If you are not inclined to join a club your donation to a club(s) where you ride will help.

Thank you to all those who have returned their PSSA membership and raffle tickets. Both help PSSA continue to promote snowmobile recreation across the state.

The current mini-grant budget has a small amount of money to be used by clubs. Lisa Vallimont, mini-grant coordinator, sent e-mails to all club grant contacts this past weekend. These funds are for emergency use and have the same conditions as all minigrants. Deadline for completed applications is October 15, 2021 5pm. No late or incomplete applications will be accepted. This round completion date is December 1, 2021 5pm. Clubs have been encouraged to think ahead and have a plan for future projects. This will make applications much easier and quicker to complete.

The current 25.1 grant deadline is November 1, 2021.

Club grant contact persons are unsung heroes for their clubs. Much time and research is involved in completing these applications. Thank them for their research and writing skills.

I am going to repeat the information concerning the DCNR ATV Pilot project. It is important that snowmobilers express ideas pro/con to DCNR.

"At the request of the State Legislature DCNR implemented an ATV Pilot project. The 2021 ATV Regional Trail Connector Pilot area spans Potter and Tioga counties, but does not include the entirety of both counties. This project includes many townships, municipalities, state forest, joint-use roads, private property and limited snowmobile trails etc. As the size suggests this is a mammoth undertaking. Many meetings, research and forming partnerships with a diverse group of stakeholders was implemented by DCNR personnel. The project provides for comments from stakeholders and a report is due in 2023.

ATV riding opportunities within this pilot area are as follows:

- 208 miles of township roads currently open to ATV use
- 12 miles of PennDOT-administered roads newly open to ATV use
- 14 miles of state forest roads and trails newly open to ATV use

A similar smaller scale format has been followed by clubs for many years. Now PSSA in cooperation with clubs and private landowners needs to go BIG. There are two areas in Northwestern and Central PA which could potentially benefit the smaller communities. Once the connections are made a snowmobiler could ride and connect with trails in NY, Ohio and PA trails.

Possible projects could include the following:

- Connect the ANF trails with the Kinzua Bridge trail, Lantz Corners, Smethport, Elk State
 Forest and beyond. The equestrian riders under the leadership of Carolyn Stroup
 have made it possible for snowmobilers to use the Kinzua trail. They deserve many
 thanks.
- Connect Western PA trails with the ANF trails and Elk State Forest thru Tidioute. The Corry Snowmobile Club has done extensive work in extending the trails in southern Erie and Crawford Counties. Thank you for your hard and dedicated work.

We now need to pressure the Legislature and DCNR to provide more funding and expertise to make these connections happen.

Take time and refresh your soul. Get out and enjoy nature.

How to Prepare Your Sled

Are you ready for this winter? Is your sled ready? Let's hope it's as great as last winter! We thought this article/checklist from Backcountry Expert Jeremy Mercier and the <u>Ski-Doo</u> <u>Team</u> would help!

1. Inspect and clean Belt and clutches

I first start by removing the belt cover and giving my clutch a bath of sorts. I start by using compressed air and blow out any belt dust. I then use a scotch bright pad and XPS Parts Cleaner to clean the sheaves. I usually replace the belt at the beginning of the season so I'm starting fresh (you can use the old one as a spare if it's still in good condition.) Expert Tip: When installing the new belt or tensioning the existing one be sure to set the lowest portion of the cogs on the external surface of the drive belt even with the driven pully edge. A proper tensioned belt and a clean clutch are key to getting the correct RPM's out of the engine.

2. Check your battery. Tighten those spark plugs.

This isn't a biggie for me as my mountain sleds are always equipped with the battery-less Ski-Doo SHOT starter system, but for those of you with electric start, you'll want to test your battery to make sure it's holding the proper charge. If not, time to replace.

3. Check track tension.

Elevate the rear of the snowmobile off the ground. You will need a tension gauge (available at most auto parts stores for about \$20) to do so. You are looking for 1.25" with 16 lb. of tension in the center of the track. I tend to run my track tighter than looser. So, if it doesn't meet those specs loosen the rear axle and adjust it to the correct tension. Tighten the rear axle and spin the track a few times to make sure it's centered.

4. Inspect your track

Check for any tears, missing lugs, etc. If you've studded your track, look for any studs that may have pulled out or damaged backers. Now's the time to replace the track if needed.

5. Check your slider shoes (hyfax).

While you're down looking at the track, it's a good time to look at the hyfax as well. There is a wear line that runs the entire length and if it's even close to being worn out I replace them. Chances are if you are anything like me you'll be out as soon as it snows on some not so great snow conditions. This step is key otherwise you wear through the hyfax pretty fast and damage your rails. Changing out rails is no fun.

How to Prepare Your Sled

6. Inspect idler wheels and bearings

Idler wheels and bearings are a quick fix that can prevent a bad day. Replace as needed.

7. Inspect the rear skid.

Make sure there is no damage and the suspension is set to your liking. This is also a good time to hit all the grease zerks with winter-specific grease and inspect for any damage to your shock bodies.

8. Check your carbides

I was born in the Midwest, so good performance on the trail is not lost on me! A fresh set of ski runners goes a long way to railing those first corners of the season.

9. Check that your riser is in line with the steering post.

Proper riser height and alignment gives the rider the best feedback and handling on the snow. Take the time to make sure all your controls are set to your liking.

10. Check for proper chaincase tension.

This is easy to check. I lock my parking break and wiggle the secondary back and forth. If it moves more than 1/4"-1/2" it's time to adjust to proper tension. Refer to the manual on how-to. The key is to just tension it enough to take the play out of it. Do not over tighten. Fall is also the perfect time to refresh your chaincase oil if you didn't do it last spring.

11. Inspect for leaks and top off all fluids.

This one is pretty self-explanatory. Refer to your manual to make sure you check all fluids and top them all off or refresh if needed. Don't forget to top it off with oil (2-stroke) or change the oil (4-stroke)!

12. Check your Ski Stance

Ski stance. One of the most common culprits of handling issues, ensure your skis are 1/8-inch to 1/4-inch toe out. Ski-Doo Brand Ambassador Rob Koenig shows you a few more details in the video above.

13. Beauty treatment

Lastly, give your baby a little love and polish her up!





NEW STUDY FROM STRATEGYR HIGHLIGHTS A \$1.7 BILLION GLOBAL MARKET FOR SNOWMOBILES BY 2026

Global Snowmobiles Market to Reach \$1.7 Billion by 2026

Amid the COVID-19 crisis, the global market for Snowmobiles estimated at US\$1.4 Billion in the year 2020, is projected to reach a revised size of US\$1.7 Billion by 2026, growing at a CAGR of 3.3% over the analysis period. Entry Level Snowmobile, one of the segments analyzed in the report, is projected to record a 4.4% CAGR and reach US\$537.1 Million by the end of the analysis period. After a thorough analysis of the business implications of the pandemic and its induced economic crisis, growth in the Mountain Snowmobile segment is readjusted to a revised 4% CAGR for the next 7-year period.

The U.S. Market is Estimated at \$430 Million in 2021, While China is Forecast to Reach \$305.5 Million by 2026

The Snowmobiles market in the U.S. is estimated at US\$430 Million in the year 2021. China, the world`s second largest economy, is forecast to reach a projected market size of US\$305.5 Million by the year 2026 trailing a CAGR of 3.1% over the analysis period. Among the other noteworthy geographic markets are Japan and Canada, each forecast to grow at 3.1% and 2.8% respectively over the analysis period. Within Europe, Germany is forecast to grow at approximately 3.3% CAGR.

Utility Snowmobile Segment to Reach US\$295.3 Million by the year 2026

In the global Utility Snowmobile segment, USA, Canada, Japan, China and Europe will drive the 3.3% CAGR estimated for this segment. These regional markets accounting for a combined market size of US\$197 Million in the year 2020 will reach a projected size of US\$246.5 Million by the close of the analysis period. China will remain among the fastest growing in this cluster of regional markets.


A "season of shivers" awaits much of America this year, the publication predicts.

PENNSYLVANIA — The Old Farmer's Almanac says a "season of shivers" with brutally cold temperatures and lots of snow awaits much of the United States this winter - including much of the Keystone State.

"This coming winter could well be one of the longest and coldest that we've seen in years," Janice Stillman, editor of The Old Farmer's Almanac, said in a news release.

In Pennsylvania, expect cold and snowy conditions in the easternmost and westernmost parts of the state, including in Philadelphia and Pittsburgh. Central Pennsylvania will be equally cold, but should escape the heavy snows forecast for Philadelphia and Pittsburgh areas.


