Check with the location where you intend to ride before you ride. It is best to check with the local club, Allegheny National Forest, Game Commission and the State depending on where you will ride before you go. Follow local, state and federal guidelines. Other states have regulations that may affect where/when you can ride. Ride, Enjoy and Be Safe!

Many clubs received a mini-grant via PSSA Mini-Grant Program to be used to maintain, upgrade and improve trails and grooming. It takes much work and dedication to make our trails top notch and enjoyable to ride. Without their dedication and spirit of volunteerism we would not enjoy the trails we have today. If you haven't thanked them already, please do so. Join a club and join PSSA.

PLAN AHEAD - TWO IMPORTANT MEETINGS:

DCNR recently presented their income/expenses to the Board on Tuesday, December 21, 2021. This information will be shared with the membership during a future meeting. Hopefully Meeting #2 will include DCNR personnel.

Meeting #1 –Wednesday, January 19, 2022 7pm PSSA Information Meeting – PSSA has not forgotten about your responses to our past survey. Yes, we are very interested in member comments, ideas etc. Committees have been hard at work for the benefit of all snowmobilers. The Trail and Registration Committees have been having discussions concerning relevant issues which involve clubs, DCNR and PSSA. What does PSSA do? The Registration Fee Committee is doing in-depth research of funding and fee structures of other states. The Website Committee is continually updating the website, Keystone Snowmobiler and Facebook. General information concerning PSSA will also be noted. Please join us for a Zoom meeting on January 19, 2022 at 7pm. (You will also be able to participate in the meeting by phone.) You must register to receive your personal information to attend.

Meeting #2 - DCNR- PSSA plans to schedule a meeting with DCNR personnel in the next several months. We need all members to attend this meeting. Income/Expenses of running a snowmobile program across the state will be presented. Club should prepare for this meeting. Clubs are asked to review your last several years of income/expenses. Realistically, in a good snowmobile season what does it cost to maintain your trails/trailhead? Do you have a groomer / equipment replacement fund? How many hours/miles does your club groom? Maintain trails? What does a club do which does not groom? PSSA needs this kind of data from clubs to support/justify a position on registration fee increases and ultimately have fair/equitable distribution of registration funds. Without pertinent data we have little to prove what PSSA and club expenses and needs are. Meeting information will be distributed as it becomes available.

Ride Command – see advertisement – PSSA does not have an official stance on this technology. Clubs are advised to use caution, check liability issues and have everything in writing.

MOA – Maryland training for pilots – Maryland –check with your representatives – these training sessions involve low fly overs of designated areas in Pennsylvania. There is concern about the effect of noise and disturbance of wild life in these areas.

Willow Creek Snowmobile Club opens new trail

From the Bradford Era

December in Bradford tends to have that effect. When the infamous snow blankets the area sooner or later, Norm Strotman will surely breathe a sigh of relief.

Strotman runs the Willow Creek Snowmobile Club, and has been waiting patiently for two things.

One, for rifle season to end. Snowmobile season cannot begin until rifle season is over. And two, for the snow to fall.

The former happened this past weekend, and while the latter is still a work in progress, all signs indicate heavy snowfall in time for the holidays. That's even more important this year, as the snowmobile club has expanded.

They've added a new trail, approximately six miles long, that stretches between the Pine Acres Country Club and the Westline area.

"It'll provide a better and faster route down between those two areas," said Strotman. "Help with some of the congestion on the snowmobile trails, too. It was kind of a lengthy process."

Winter in Pennsylvania at times is a winter wonderland. North central Pa. is known for year-round recreation which means many of us trade in our hiking boots, mountain bikes, and boats, for snowshoes, skis, and snowmobiles once enough snow covers the ground. There's so much fun to be had right outside our doors, but we need to remember that the season comes with its share of conditions that could turn an enjoyable outing into a hospital visit.

Prepare

Before You Leave

Preparation is key to staying safe whenever you head outdoors in the winter. The bitterly cold of the season mixed with snowstorms, ice, wind, rain, sleet, and whatever else Mother Nature throws our way, can often cause serious, life-threatening injuries, no matter how careful we are. When heading outdoors, consider what the worst-case scenario may be and plan accordingly.

Being out in the elements unexpectedly, or underdressed and underprepared can put you at a greater risk for developing hypothermia or frostbite. But even when under cover, hypothermia can still develop. Plan, dress accordingly, and even include items in a backpack to take along should you need them. It's always safer to have the items and not need them, then to be without. When selecting an outfit consider moisture wicking or loose-fitting light-weight layers of clothing, a hat, gloves, insulated socks and water-repellant shoes. Steer clear of cotton and look to synthetics and wool blends.

FOREST COUNTY SMC

Greetings from beautiful Tionesta/Kellettville area. The snowmobile season officially kicked off on Friday, December 17, 2021 in the Allegheny National Forest (ANF). But warm temperatures and no snow in the forecast is not the Christmas gift we were expecting.

Club volunteers have been busy getting ready for the 2021-22 snowmobile season. In September, we completed a much-needed project that was partially funded by a PSSA mini-grant. This area is south of Chapman State Park on the main snowmobile trail ASL#1. As you can see by the pictures, the area was always wet and muddy unless we had a hard freeze. In 2020, we purchased most of the stone material with leftover winter grooming monies but the weather didn't cooperate. The PSSA mini-grant funded additional stone and C&G Moore Enterprises of Tidioute, Pa to complete the project. The stone was dumped approximately ½ mile from the jobsite because the remote area is not accessible by dump trucks. The contractor hauled the material (130 tons) to the jobsite via the narrow trail. Then they graded the area to promote water runoff, relocate the trail and install the gravel. The contractor donated his time and equipment to grade the ½ mile section of snowmobile trail leading to the jobsite. The value of this work was \$1800. The work was not included in the scope but since he is a snowmobiler, he wanted to help make a difference for riders. A big thanks to Clint and Chris for their extra efforts. As you can see by the photos, the area is now dry and snowmobilers will find a safe trail that doesn't require fighting their way through the muck. In addition, the groomer will now be able to groom this section more effectively. A special thanks to club volunteers, PSSA, DCNR, and C&G Moore for a successful project.

In October and November, club volunteers were busy getting ready for the new season. One weekend was spent making repairs and performing maintenance on the club's groomer and drag. Then they were out removing fallen trees, trimming branches and removing debris from our trails.

The clubs in the ANF helped the Forest Service open the gates for the opening day on Dec. 17th. But warm temperatures and lack of snow meant no riding. Club volunteers used the opportunity to clear the latest downed trees and debris during their travels.

In November, the ANF clubs had their fall meeting with the U.S. Forest Service. We had a good meeting and firmed up plans between the clubs and FS for the 2021-22 season. The clubs will be under a new five-year grooming agreement that helps with the club's volunteer grooming efforts. Willow Creek Snowmobile Club had their new Prinoth groomer there for everyone to checkout. With their new groomer, there will now be seven groomers being operated by club volunteers across the ANF's 365 miles of trails. The ASL#1 (Loop) will be fully open this year. Fuel options continue to be a challenge on the ANF with Graybill's being the latest station not being open this year. If you come to ride be sure to plan your route accordingly.

A BLAST FROM THE PAST

While cleaning out our parents' house since they have passed on, my siblings and I came across snowmobile magazines and PSSA newspapers as far back as 1982 that my mother saved. I am enjoying reading these and reminiscing about my snowmobile experiences from those years. I would like to continue sharing some of the interesting articles from these newspapers.

From the 1982 fall issues of the PSSA News, we learn that Pennsylvania snowmobile clubs were busy over the summer hosting snowmobile water cross races. After the weather turned cooler in the fall, they switched to doing grass drag races. These activities seemed to be very popular as some clubs had a race every month.

Just in case any of us thought that raffling off snowmobile trips as a PSSA fundraiser was a novel idea, we should think again. The fundraiser for that year was a raffle. First and second prizes were each a one week all-expense paid trip for 2 people to West Yellowstone, Montana. Third and fourth prizes were each a one week all-expense paid for two people to Old Forge, New York. Fifth prize was an all-expense paid trip for two to the Poconos in Pennsylvania.

The 1982 PSSA Fall Meeting was held on October 15th through the 17th at the Genetti Lycoming Hotel in Williamsport; it was hosted by Region 7, which consisted of the following clubs: Cameron County Snowmobile Club from Emporium, Tri-County Snowmobilers from Lock Haven, Sugar Valley Snowmobilers from Loganton, Mifflin Township Snowmobile Club from Mifflinville, North Mount E-Z Riders from Turbotville, Nittany Mountain Snow Riders from White Deer, Potter County Snowmobile Association from Coudersport, Southern Potter Snowmobile Club from Austin, God's Country-Black Forest Snowmobile Club from Galeton, Cowanesque Valley Snow Riders from Knoxville, Elimsport Snowmobile Club from Allenwood, and Elk Grove Snowmobile Club from Benton. The invitation to the annual meeting included this: "Region Seven has organized a special attraction for those in attendance at the Fall Meeting. You will have the opportunity to go on a paddle wheel boat ride on the Susquehanna River. The boat will be departing early Saturday morning. Another tour has been scheduled to the Little League Museum. Be sure not to miss the fun! Region 7 Director, Don Solomon, and the clubs have worked hard to make this meeting enjoyable and informative." There were 240 PSSA members who attended this event.

Workshops at the annual meeting that were open for members to attend included some of these subjects: What is PSSA & Doing Your Part for PSSA; Keeping Your Club Active; Trail Grooming, Maintenance, and Tips on Marking Trails; Facts & Fallacies of Nuclear Radiation; and short presentations from the Department of Environmental Resources (DER), the Game Commission and the Bureau of State Parks. The speaker for the Awards Dinner was Merle Karst, the Vice President of Yamaha. After dinner, entertainment was provided by the Ernie Cash Band from 9:00 PM to 12:00 PM!

At this Fall Annual Meeting the following Board of Directors was elected: President – David Auker from Ephrata, Vice President – David Weaver from Huntingdon, Secretary – Paul O'Neill from Lake Ariel, Treasurer – Frank Orehek from Annville, Directors – Robert N. Davis from Nazareth, Lawrence J. Moran from Scranton, and Jerry Mueller from Zelienople. The PSSA Regional Directors were as follows: Region 1 – Richard Fairchild from Erie, Region 2 – Bert Easton from Jamestown, Region 3 East – Clifford Stiffler, Jr., from Johnstown, Region 3 West – William L. Teacher from Irwin, Region 5 – Henry Hartman from Hanover, Region 6 – David J. Coddington from Montrose, Region 7 – Donald E. Solomon from South Williamsport, and Region 8 – Lowell Morton from Annville.

The Pymatuning Trail Blazers Snowmobile Club was awarded the prestigious Pennsylvania Club of the Year Award. For their efforts they received a brand new Yamaha snowmobile from Yamaha Corporation. The club boasted membership of 130 families with 100% PSSA membership. They had numerous club activities throughout the year. At that time the club maintained approximately 200 miles of trails, mostly on private property.

Another article of interest was about a 64 feet long cake. A 1200 pound 64 feet long cake fashioned to represent a snowmobile trail was served to 7000 employees, relatives, and friends, who toured Bombardiers Valcourt Quebec Recreational Products Division and Logistics Equipment Division facilities in mid-September at the company's annual employee open house. Ski Doo at this time had a program where they would give state associations a new snowmobile if they could increase their membership. PSSA at this time had a membership of 1757 members. If they could increase membership by 600 people, they would be given a new snowmobile from Bombardier.




