Hyner Mountain SMC

The Hyner Mountain Snowmobile Club's annual youth Pennsylvania snowmobile safety course will be conducted on Saturday, November 4, 2023 at the Hyner Mountain Snowmobile Club lodge, which is located along Route 44 approximately 6 miles north of Haneyville, PA in Clinton County.

Pennsylvania's Snowmobile Law requires youngsters between the ages of 10 to 15 to earn a safety certificate before they may lawfully operate a snowmobile in the state, except upon lands owned or leased by their parent or legal guardian. The course is free for all participants.

The goal of the course, which was developed and is administered by the PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, is to develop safe attitudes and practices in all keystone state snowmobilers. Student manuals and workbooks will be utilized to illustrate the sport's basic principles and safety concepts. The course content will cover winter clothing, machine safety, and snowmobile laws and regulations. Class participants qualify for their certificate by completing their workbooks and achieving a score of 80% or better on the final examination.

Course instructors include Hyner Mountain Snowmobile Club Members Rich Ebersole of Cornwall, PA and Harrison Langley, Jr. of Palmyra, PA and Henry Hartman of Hanover, PA.

The team of DCNR-certified instructors conducting this course have 131 years of combined and varied snowmobiling experience around North America and the world. So, come prepared to have fun and learn in-person from experienced snowmobilers.

Plus, there will be gear and equipment and a modern snowmobile for students to experience and ask questions about.

Hyner Mountain SMC

Unlike the DCNR's on-line course, there is NO FEE TO ATTEND, you will receive your safety certificate at the end of the course vs. waiting and hoping for it to arrive via US mail, and the Hyner Mountain Snowmobile Club will even provide a FREE lunch to all attendees.

Parents are to accompany their children to registration so that the required forms may be completed. Registration begins at 7:30 AM; class starts promptly at 8:00 AM and will end by 4:00 PM. The Hyner Mountain Snowmobile Club will provide lunch.

Pre-registration is required. Adults are encouraged to stay for the day to attend the course with their youth students or join the club's members in the living room area of the lodge for a day of conversation and fellowship around the lodge's mountain stone fireplace. The club's parking area provides direct access to both the Sproul and Tiadaughton State Forest trail systems, so come and discover why the club's motto is "a great place to park your sled and rest your head"!

The Hyner Mountain Snowmobile Club is located approximately five (5) miles north of Haneyville. From the intersection of Route 44 and Hyner Mountain Road, continue north (straight) on Route 44 and look for Pat Reeders's Tavern on the right. At the end of Pat Reeder's driveway, look for the gravel road on the left which is marked by a green road sign: "Reeders Addition Lane". Make a left onto Reeder's Addition Lane and proceed to the end where the lane splits into three (3) separate driveways. Take the middle, gated driveway to the Hyner Mountain Snowmobile Club lodge which is a large, 2-story brown building. The club's parking area encircles the lodge.

In the News

DCNR funds snowmobile and ATV trails in northern and central PA

More than \$1 million is going toward recreation companies in central and northern Pennsylvania for snowmobile and ATV trail maintenence and construction.

The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources is awarding \$677,200 to Rock Run Recreation Inc. to rehabilitate ATV trails in Cambria and Clearfield counties. Central Mountains ATV Association Inc. is getting \$320,000 for a trail in Clinton County.

DCNR is also granting \$126,000 to Tri-County Snowblazers and McKean Area Snowmobile Club to go toward buying equipment and maintaining and constructing 252 miles of snowmobile trails in Warren, Crawford and Erie counties.

Representative Kathy Rapp, who serves Warren, Forest and parts of Crawford counties, said outdoor sports are important to the area.

"So I think if some of that money can be returned to the snow belt areas of Pennsylvania where they enjoy snowmobiling, that's a good thing," Rapp said.

Rapp also said the trails will promote tourism in central and northern Pennsylvania.

See the full list of funding in central and northern Pennsylvania below:

- Rock Run Recreation, Inc., \$677,200 to rehabilitate approximately 30.5 miles of the 140-mile ATV trail system at Rock Run Recreation Area in Chest Township, Cambria County and Chest Township, Clearfield County.
- Central Mountains ATV Association, Inc., \$320,000 to design for the development of approximately 6 miles of the Whiskey Springs to Bloody Skillet ATV Connector Trail in South Renovo Borough, Clinton County.
- Tri-County Snowblazers, Inc., \$115,000 to purchase equipment to maintain and construct approximately 90 miles of snowmobile trails in Erie, Warren and Crawford counties.
- McKean Area Snowmobile Club, Inc., \$11,000 to purchase equipment to maintain and construct approximately 162 miles of snowmobile trails in Erie, Crawford and Warren counties.

Dutch Trail Cutters Celebrate 50 Years

In the fall of 2021, we started to tell you about the history of the Lancaster County based Dutch Trail Cutters Snowmobile Club, which was formed in early 1971. Here is a flashback from 50 years ago.

An earlier article in the series mentioned the club purchasing 5 acres of land in Havice Valley, Mifflin County, in 1972. In July 1973, there was discussion about getting electric lines run to the property. Several other landowners along the private lane into our ground were also interested in electric service but not all of them would commit to the expense. The club decided to wait until more neighbors agree to the service, since the club property is the last one on a half-mile long dead-end lane. At the August club meeting it was reported the taxes on the land were paid: a whopping \$ 7.20 fee! In September 1973, the club members approved having the electric company place a pole on the land at a cost of \$ 350.00.

At the October 1973 club meeting, two members reported having attended the PSSA Annual Meeting. Among the news: "Game Commission said more trails will be opened. DER said bill was passed for snowmobile registration and they will handle it. Will be \$10.00 every 2 years. Money will be used to make more and better trails for all recreational vehicles." During the same meeting, members voted to form a Building Committee and have them research constructing a 28 x 40 clubhouse.

Today, 50 years later, the Dutch Trail Cutters are still a 100% PSSA club! Every member of the club is also a member of the State organization, supporting snowmobiling across the entire Commonwealth. In future articles, we will reveal how the clubhouse was built. The Dutch Trail Cutters Snowmobile Club has memberships available. Snowmobile Day - October 28th!

Snowmobile Day should be a fun, family festival type event, where BBQ, refreshments, music, and an open house can get snowmobilers excited for the upcoming season. Snowmobile Clubs are encouraged to participate in the activities and serve food, coordinate special events, conduct safety classes, sell trail or riding permits, and registrations. This is a great opportunity for clubs and associations to increase membership and recruit volunteers for trail maintenance activities.

Snowmobile associations and clubs are encouraged to contact local Snowmobile Dealerships, Chambers of Commerce, Visitor and Convention Bureaus, and regional media to support and help with a local event.
