### **The Pennsylvania Constitution**

• "The people have a right to clean air, pure water, and to the preservation of the natural, scenic, historic and esthetic values of the environment. Pennsylvania's public natural resources are the common property of all the people, including generations yet to come. As trustee of these resources, the Commonwealth shall conserve and maintain them for the benefit of all the people."

**Article I, Section 27** 

The Environmental Rights Amendment was approved by a four-to-one margin of Pennsylvania voters in May, 1971



#### **DCNR Vision Statement**

"To conserve and maintain Pennsylvania's public natural resources for the benefit of all people, including generations yet to come, we will take intentional action to ensure DCNR lands are accessible to all, provide inclusive and equitable programs and services, and recruit and retain a diverse workforce."

> DCNR was created by Act 18 and established on July 1, 1995



## Act 97 of 2016

- Act 97 of 2016 required Snowmobile and ATV to have separate restricted accounts
- Fees and fines are deposited respectively
- Other revenues (liquid fuels, sales tax commission, etc) and costs are split 87% ATV and 13% Snowmobile
- DCNR also pays for trail maintenance and grants from this funding







#### DCNR Snowmobile Program Services Provided

- Over 2800 miles of trails on DCNR lands
  - 2500 miles on private lands
  - 400 miles on Game Commission land
  - 300 miles on Federal land (ANF)
- **Trail Grooming**: 34 full size groomers and 10 groomer attachments owned and operated by DCNR (\$150,000-\$220,000 average cost each)
- **85 staff** who assist with grooming, related maintenance of trails, and outreach with snowmobile/trail groups.



DCNR Snowmobile Program Services Provided (con't)

- **Public safety** provided by DCNR Rangers
- **Trail maps** printed and distributed
- Parking areas and comfort facilities maintained
- Registration and Dealer Services

## **Grants for Snowmobile Projects** Funding Types

PA Recreational Trails Grants ("motorized")
 O Federally funded program

Snowmobile Grants

 Funded with snowmobile registrations



**Recreational Trail or "Motorized" Grants** (federal source)

- <u>Eligible Applicants</u>: municipalities, nonprofits, for-profits, state and federal agencies
- <u>Eligible Project Types</u>: development, rehab and maintenance; educational programs; and equipment purchases (\*new\*)
- 30% dedicated to "motorized" projects Approximately \$550,000 annually
- 80/20 match requirement and additional federal review and approval



**Recreational Trail or "Motorized" Grants** (federal source)

• Equipment purchase grants are now allowed through a new Buy America waiver

 Projects receiving less than \$500,000 in federal financial assistance are waived from the federal Buy America requirements.



# **Snowmobile Grants** (from snowmobile registrations)

- <u>Eligible Applicants</u>: municipalities, nonprofits and for-profits
- <u>Eligible Project Types</u>: land acquisition, planning, development (rehab and maintenance), equipment purchases, educational programs



# **Snowmobile Grants** (from snowmobile registrations)

- No match required, but encouraged
- Two grant rounds per year (spring and fall):
  - Spring grant round is Feb. 1 Mar. 29, 2024
    Fall grant round is Aug. 1 Sept. 30, 2024
- Very limited funding available. Average amount of total annual funding over last 5 years was only \$135,000.


