

## How Much Snow Will We See This Winter In PA?



How cold and snowy will the upcoming winter be in Pennsylvania? While winter doesn't officially start until Dec. 21, meteorological winter begins this weekend —on Dec. 1. Several forecasters have put forward their predictions for how snowy the season will be here in the Keystone State. Here's a look at what they're saying:

**AccuWeather:** Winter will have some "meteorological twists and turns" that could bring bursts of heavy snow and blasts of bitterly cold air...

**The Old Farmer's Almanac:** In its <u>2024-2025 outlook</u>, The Old Farmer's Almanac released calls for the coming season to be "a calmer, gentler winter" for much of the United States.

**The Farmers' Almanac:** Its forecast calls for rapid-fire storms that will bring both rain and snow, with little downtime in between.

**NOAA:** In the Northeast, temperatures are expected to be above normal up and down the Eastern Seaboard. Precipitation is expected to be above normal in much of the region, that forecast predicts.

## Why Ski-Doo is the only snowmobile permitted in Yellowstone

Replete with stunning hydrothermal and geologic features and thriving wildlife across 2.2 million acres, <u>Yellowstone</u>

<u>National Park</u> is a national treasure. It's also America's first national park; former president Ulysses S. Grant made it official on March 1, 1872.



The <u>national park</u> maintains its beauty with a stringent set of environmental regulations

that places the welfare of the park front and center. For example, during the winter months only certain kinds of vehicles and snowmobiles are allowed on the groomed trails, and they must meet the park's <u>Best Available Technology (BAT) standard</u> for emissions. Only one snowmobile brand currently meets the criteria: Ski-Doo.

Ultimately, snowmobiles remained, but with new safeguards in place for the Yellowstone ecosystem. Through that process, the national park service learned about new emissions technology offered in four-stroke snowmobile engines that decreased carbon emissions by more than 70 percent and decreased sound levels by about half.

As a result, updated regulations today state that snowmobiles entering the park must operate at or below 67 dBA (the measurement of sound levels) and must be certified for certain emissions levels. According to the National Park Service, a snowmobile "will be certified for six consecutive winter seasons following its manufacture or until the snowmobile travels 6,000 miles, whichever occurs later, and model year 2015-2017 snowmobiles must have less than 6,000 miles on the odometer to be approved."

Ski-Doo's approved-for-Yellowstone snowmobiles employ a four-stroke engine, which is more efficient and emits fewer toxic fumes than the two-stroke engines offered in other snow machines. The company's ACE (advanced combustion efficiency) engines are designed with a square bore and stroke in a spherical combustion chamber and tuned to use less fuel to create power. Thus, fewer emissions. YouTube channel driving 4 answers does a great job explaining the difference between two- and four-stroke engines and how they work. (Continue reading on Popular Science)

### **Snowmobile Safety**

Our snowmobile friends in New York offer some great snowmobile safety tips:

- Inspect and properly maintain your snowmobile; make sure it is in good working order and carry emergency supplies (e.g. food, water, warm clothing and safety equipment).
- Always wear a helmet with DOT-certified standards and make sure you wear appropriate snowmobile gear including: snow bibs, water-proof jackets, boots, and gloves to withstand the elements (cold temperatures and moisture).
- Always ride with a buddy or group and tell a responsible person where you will be riding and your expected return time.
- Slow down. Ride responsibly. Ride within your ability, ride to the right and always operate at a safe and prudent speed.
- Stay on marked trails. Respect landowners and obey posted signs.
- Never drink alcohol or use drugs and ride.
- Frozen bodies of water are not designated trails; if you plan to ride on ice, proceed
  with caution and be aware of potential hazards under the snow. If you choose to
  ride on ice, wear a snowmobile suit with flotation built-in and carry a set of ice
  picks as a precaution.


